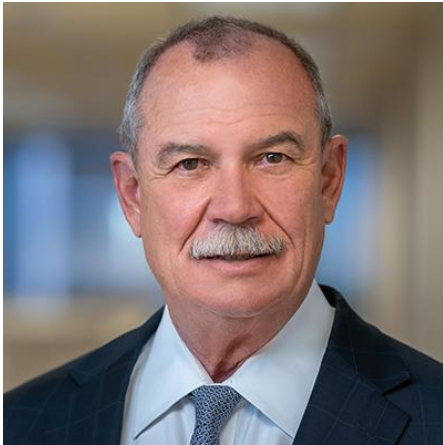

Fintech Lending Fees

Represented client in a master service agreement with a major national bank for bank liability to client for fees.

Defended Real Estate Company from Fraud Allegations

Represented a real estate agency of Keller Williams being sued by a purported purchaser of real estate for breach of the duty of care and fraud in the handling of a transaction with a claim in excess of \$800,000. Damages against the client were reduced to \$12,500 – less than the settlement offer, while the seller was assessed damages and punitive damages in excess of \$750,000, some portion of which will be trebled.

Professional Malpractice Litigation

Insurance Litigation

Construction Litigation

App. 1988) and Gardiner and Gardiner Builders v. Swapp, et al., 656 P.2d 429 (Utah 1982).

Natural Resources, Mining and Environmental Litigation

Mr. Snow has worked with natural resource companies in a variety of areas, including operations, environmental, construction, acquisition, leasing and royalty matters. He has also defended actions

involving environmental cost recovery, the Clean Air Act, and the Clean Water Act. An example of cases handled by Mr. Snow include Valley Camp of Utah, Inc. v. Babbitt, 24 F.3d 1263 (10th Cir. 1994); Andalex Resources, Inc. v. Myers, 871 P.2d 1041 (Utah Ct. App. 1994); and Trail Mountain Coal Company v. ARCO Coal Sales Co., 749 P.2d 637 (Utah 1988).

Trademark and Intellectual Property Litigation

Mr. Snow has actively involved in litigation in the area of trademark and intellectual property. The cases have included matters involving name, trademark and trade dress similarities and infringement, and patent infringement actions. For example, Promega Corp. v. Lifecodes Corp., D. Utah, 1999 U.S. Dist. Lexis 21094.

Lender Liability Litigation

During his entire practice, Mr. Snow has actively represented bank and other lenders in various types of litigation, including what is commonly referred to as lender liability claims. Mr. Snow has also had extensive experience representing banks in connection with operational matters. An example of a cases handled by Mr. Snow include Stevensen v. Goodson, 924 P.2d 339 (Utah 1996); Solomon v. Security Pacific Bank Nevada, 138 B.R. 608 (D. Nev. 1992); Ream v. Fitzen, 581 P.2D 185 (Utah 1978); and Murray First Thrift & Loan Co. v. Benson, 563 P.2d 185 (Utah 1977).

Probate, Trust and Tax Litigation

Mr. Snow is experienced in litigation involving probate and trust matters. Mr. Snow has handled several cases regarding the validity of wills or codicils.
